Read Matthew 6:9 and John 14:6. How do these verses indicate that we should pray only to Jehovah and that we should do so through Jesus?
Read 1 John 5:14.
What are examples of things we can "ask according to [God's] will"? (Clue: See Matthew 6:9-13; Colossians 4:12; James 1:5.)



Unlike many important people, Jehovah doesn't require us to have an appointment to speak with him. We can pray to him at any time

We should pray continually and sincerely. (See chapter 17 of the *Bible Teach* book, paragraphs 13-15.)

Read Matthew 26:41 and 1 Thessalonians 5:17. How do these verses indicate that Jehovah puts no limit on how long or how often we can talk to him in prayer?				
Read 1 Chronicles 16:36 and 1 Corinthians 14:16. What is an appropriate thing to say at the end of each prayer?				
What are some things <i>you</i> can pray about this week?
